

Adopt-A-Cabin Refurbishment Campaign

Our county successfully raised our first \$5,000 to refurbish our adopted cabin, Hemlock (on the girls' side of camp)!



4-H Camp Piedmont Board has a goal to have all 14 cabins refurbished and adopted by all 8 counties who attend camp. Contractors will be doing work under the leadership of the maintenance manager. Camp Piedmont is asking each county to Adopt-A-Cabin. The cost to refurbish a single cabin is \$5,000. Refurbishment will include:

- New roof, walls, floors, ceilings, bunks, and doors.
- New lighting and windows installed.

The Tuscarawas County 4-H Committee's next goal is to raise and donate \$5,000 for a cabin on the boys' side of camp. The committee is encouraging 4-H clubs to participate by making donations to the Cabin Campaign. The Tuscarawas County 4-H Committee will donate all Cabin Campaign funds to Camp Piedmont to complete our cabin refurbishment. If funds collected exceed \$5,000, the remaining funds will be used to help fund another cabin. Funds will be taken all year to help with the campaign.

This can be counted as Community Service for those clubs making a donation. Clubs can be creative in terms of fundraising: they may make a contribution from their club treasury, hold a fundraiser with proceeds dedicated to the Cabin Campaign, collect donations, etc.
