Enrollment Deadline

Enrollments are due April 15, 2024. Brand-new 4-H families need to complete paper enrollment forms. All other members and advisors need to re-enroll themselves in 4-H Online. Even if a member is returning after being out of the program for a little while, they still have a profile in the system. We just need to unarchive them. DO NOT CREATE A NEW FAMILY PROFILE! Livestock Quality Assurance

Quality Assurance is a requirement put forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture for youth who are exhibiting livestock at a county fair. In short, if you are taking an animal to the fair (whether 4-H or FFA), you MUST complete an approved QA program. We have one general QA session and a dairy-specific QA session remaining on our 2024 calendar.

Remaining sessions will be held:

- Monday, April 15, 6:30 PM at Dover Middle School (Registration begins at 6:00 PM)
- Sunday, April 21, 2:00 PM, Union Hill UMC (Registration begins at 1:30 PM) Dairy Specific

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is an online based QA and is also available to members but remember, it does cost a small fee that cannot be waived as this platform does not belong to Ohio State. More info on QA (including YQCA) can be found on our website: https://go.osu.edu/tusc4-hqa. If choosing this option, the online session must be completed no later than June 1, 2024. A copy of the completion certificate must be submitted to our office and a county QA packet picked up (signature is required).

Market Poultry Projects

If you plan to exhibit market chickens, market ducks, or market turkeys at the fair this year, you need to submit a poultry order form and payment to our office **by April 15**. The form can be found at https://tuscarawas.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/4-h-livestock/small-animals.

Livestock Clinic Opportunities

The Holmes County Show Ring Success Seminar will be held on Saturday, April 13 at the Holmes County Fairgrounds (Harvest Ridge). Although they are offering QA in coordination with this event, it is not a Tuscarawas County QA; members may attend if they would like but it

will NOT count toward their Tuscarawas County QA requirement. Session 1 starts after QA at 9:45. This free event focuses on beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, rabbits, and horses.
