RegMax

Create with 4-H Day

Livestock Quality Assurance

Quality Assurance is a requirement put forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture for youth who are exhibiting livestock at a county fair. In short, if you are taking an animal to the fair (whether 4-H or FFA), you MUST complete an approved QA program. We have two general QA sessions and a dairy-specific QA session remaining on our 2024 calendar.

- Thursday, March 7, 6:30 PM at Dover Middle School
- Monday, April 15, 6:30 PM at Dover Middle School
- Sunday, April 21, 2:00 PM, Union Hill UMC (Registration begins at 1:30 PM) Dairy Specific

We will be offering another test out opportunity on Thursday, March 7 at 5:45 PM.

4-H Camp Registration opens February 29!
